

Ritual, Songs & Prayers for Adoration

The following guide has been prepared to assist in the celebration of both Adoration and Adoration with Benediction. It is based on the official ritual, but adapted where the ritual provides options or remains silent.

Prior to Adoration, the altar should be prepared with four to six lighted candles, a corporal, and the monstrance. The monstrance should be placed off-centre on the corporal on the altar, turned to the side away from the congregation until the Blessed Sacrament is placed in it.

A lay minister should be dressed in an alb or in other suitable liturgical vestment. An ordained minister will wear an alb and stole and may also wear a cope (and a humeral veil for benediction).

The ordinary minister for Adoration is a priest or bishop; a deacon may lead the adoration and even benediction if no priest is available.

An acolyte or other duly authorised lay minister may expose and repose the Blessed Sacrament, but may not lead benediction.

1. Opening Hymn – *All Stand*

2. Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament – *All Kneel*

3. Adoration

During this time, silence may be observed, traditional hymns or songs of worship may be sung, scripture proclaimed, antiphons prayed, and/or brief exhortations given.

4. Benediction – *All Kneel*

(Incense Sacrament)

- Antiphon & Closing Prayer

If an ordained minister is leading the liturgy, he may bless the people with the monstrance.

5. Reposition of the Blessed Sacrament – *All Kneel*

- Final Hymn

During the hymn, the Blessed Sacrament is reposed in the Tabernacle. After this, the people stand and the minister departs the sanctuary.

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament

All Kneel

During the hymn, or in silence afterwards, the minister unlocks the Tabernacle, opens the door, then genuflects. The minister then reverently carries the Host in the lunette inside the custodia (which holds the lunette) to the altar, places it on the altar and genuflects. The minister then removes the lunette from the custodia and places the lunette containing the Blessed Sacrament in the monstrance, and orients it toward the people. He then places the custodia at the side of the altar behind the candles, then genuflects, and moves to kneel at the front of the altar.

If incense is to be used, while the people are singing, or in silence, the minister charges the thurible and then incenses the Blessed Sacrament.

In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

People: Amen.

The minister introduces the time of adoration, concluding with one of the following prayers (or similar):

1. Lord Jesus Christ,
you gave us the Eucharist
as the memorial of your suffering and death.
May our worship of this sacrament
of Your body and blood
help us to experience the salvation You won for us
and the peace of the kingdom
where You live with the Father and the Holy Spirit,
one God, for ever and ever.
2. Lord, give to our hearts the light of faith
and the fire of love,
that we may worship in spirit and in truth
our God and Lord, present in this sacrament,
who lives and reigns for ever and ever.

3. Lord our God,
in this great sacrament
we come into the presence of Jesus Christ, Your Son,
born of the Virgin Mary
and crucified for our salvation.
May we who declare our faith
in this fountain of love and mercy,
drink from it the waters of everlasting life.
We ask this through Christ our Lord.

Adoration

After the prayer, another song may be sung, or one of the Antiphons from the next section may be chanted or spoken. After a brief period of silent adoration at the foot of the altar, the minister bows to the Blessed Sacrament, then stands and silently departs.

During this time, silence may be observed, hymns may be sung, scripture proclaimed, and/or brief exhortations given.

Benediction

Toward the end of the exposition the priest or deacon goes to the altar, genuflects, and kneels. Then a hymn or other eucharistic song is sung. Meanwhile the minister, while kneeling, incenses the sacrament if the exposition has taken place with the monstrance.

After the prayer the priest or deacon puts on the humeral veil, genuflects, and takes the monstrance or ciborium. He makes the sign of the cross over the people with the monstrance or ciborium, in silence. Returning to his place, he leads the people in the recitation (or chanting) of the Divine Praises.

Reposition

After the blessing the priest or deacon who gave the blessing, or another priest or deacon, replaces the blessed sacrament in the tabernacle and genuflects. Meanwhile the people may sing or say an acclamation, and the minister then leaves.
