# 8 August – St Mary of the Cross MacKillop

#### SOLEMNITY; white

RELIGIOUS / Born in Melbourne (Australia) in 1842. Died in Sydney on this day in 1909. Took the religious name Mary of the Cross. Responding to the isolation of colonial families, she pioneered a new form of religious life to provide education for their children. She and her sisters shared the life of the poor and the itinerant, offering special care to destitute women and children. Remembered for her eagerness to discover God's will in all things, for her charity in the face of calumny, and for her abiding trust in God's providence.

But after a while the stream where Elijah lay hidden dried up, for the country had had no rain. And then the word of the Lord came to him,

'Get up and go to Zarephath in Sidonia, and stay there.

I have ordered a widow there to give you food.'

So he went to Sidon and when he reached the city gate, there was a widow gathering sticks. He called to her and said,

'Please bring a little water in a pitcher for me to drink.'

She was on her way to fetch it when he called to her, saying,

'And bring me a scrap of bread in your hand.'

She replied,

'As the Lord your God lives, I have no baked bread, but only a handful of meal in a jar and a little oil in a jug; I am just gathering a stick or two to go and prepare this for myself and my son to eat, and then we shall die.'

But Elijah said to her,

'Don't be afraid, go and do as you have said; but first make a little cake of it for me and bring it to me, and make some for yourself and for your son afterwards. For the Lord, the God of Israel, says this:

"Jar of meal shall not be spent, jug of oil shall not be emptied, till the day when the Lord sends rain on the face of the earth."

The woman went and did as Elijah told her and they ate the food, she, himself and her son. The jar of meal was not spent nor the jug of oil emptied, just as the Lord had foretold through Elijah.

#### A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

Jesus said to his disciples:

'Therefore I tell you not to worry about your life, what you should eat, nor about your body, what you should wear. Surely life is more than food, and the body more than clothing! Look at the birds in the sky. They do not sow or reap or gather into barns; yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not worth much more than they are? Can any of you, by worrying, add one single cubit to your span of life?

And why worry about clothing? Learn from the grasses of the fields, how they grow; they neither work nor spin, yet I assure you that not even Solomon in all his glory was clothed like one of these.
