# A reading from the prophet Isaiah

Thus says the Lord:

Here is my servant whom I uphold, my chosen one in whom my soul delights. I have put my spirit upon him, he will bring fair judgement to the nations. He will not cry out or raise his voice, his voice will not be heard in the street.

A crushed reed he will not break nor will he snuff out a faltering wick. He will establish fair judgement for the nations. He will not grow faint or be discouraged until he has established fair judgement on earth and the coastlands are waiting for his guidance.
