First Reading ‡ Isaiah 8:23-9:3

In the Galilean country, the people have seen a great light.

A reading from the prophet Isaiah

As in the past the Lord humbled the land of Zebulun and the land of Naphtali, so in the future he will glorify the Way of the Sea, beyond the Jordan, the territory of the nations.

The people that walked in darkness have seen a great light; on the inhabitants of a country in shadow dark as death, light has blazed forth.

You have enlarged the nation, you have increased its joy; they rejoice before you as people rejoice at harvest time, as they exult when they are dividing plunder.

For the yoke that weighed on them, the bar across their shoulders, the rod of their oppressor, these you have broken as on the day of Midian.

Second Reading ‡ 1 Corinthians 1:10-13.17

I appeal to you, my brothers and sisters, make up the differences between you.

A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians

Brothers and sisters, I urge you, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, all to be in agreement. There should be no divisions among yourselves, so that you are united in your beliefs and judgements.

For it has been made clear to me by Chloe's people about you, brothers and sisters, that there are quarrels among you.

What I mean is that every one of you is saying, 'I belong to Paul,' or 'I belong to Apollos,' or 'I belong to Cephas,' or 'I belong to Christ.'

Has Christ been split up? Was Paul crucified for you, or were you baptised in Paul's name?

After all, Christ sent me not to baptise, but to proclaim the gospel, and not by wisdom of language, which would make the cross of Christ pointless.

Gospel [longer form] ‡ Matthew 4:12-23

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

He went to Capernaum, that the prophecy of Isaiah be fulfilled.

Hearing that John had been arrested Jesus withdrew to Galilee, and leaving Nazareth he went and settled in Capernaum, beside the lake, on the borders of Zebulun and Naphtali. This was to fulfil what was spoken by the prophet Isaiah:

Land of Zebulun! Land of Naphtali! Way of the sea beyond Jordan. Galilee of the nations! The people that sat in darkness have seen a great light; on those who lived in a country and shadow of death a light has dawned.

From then onwards Jesus began his proclamation with the message,

'Repent, for the kingdom of Heaven is close at hand.'

As he was walking by the Lake of Galilee he saw two brothers, Simon, who is called Peter, and Andrew his brother; they were making a cast into the lake with their net, for they were fishermen. And he said to them,

'Come after me and I will make you fishers of people.'

And at once they left their nets and followed him. Going on from there he saw another pair of brothers, James son of Zebedee and his brother John; they were in their boat with their father Zebedee, mending their nets, and he called them. And at once, leaving the boat and their father, they followed him.

He went round the whole of Galilee teaching in their synagogues, proclaiming the good news of the kingdom and curing all kinds of disease and illness among the people.
