A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

When Jesus returned to Capernaum, after some days word went round that he was in the house; and so many people collected that there was no room left, even in front of the door. He was proclaiming the word to them when some people came bringing him a paralytic carried by four men, but as they could not get the man to him through the crowd, they stripped the roof at the place where Jesus was; and when they had made an opening, they lowered the mat on which the paralytic lay.

Seeing their faith, Jesus said to the paralytic,

'My child, your sins are forgiven.'

Now some of the scribes were sitting there, and they discussed in their hearts,

'How can this man talk like that? It is blasphemy! Who can forgive sins but God alone?'

And at once, Jesus, aware in his spirit that they were discussing like this, said to them,

'Why do you discuss these things in your hearts?

Which is easier: to say to the paralytic,

"Your sins are forgiven" or to say, "Get up, pick up your mat and walk"?

But so that you may know that the Son of man has authority to forgive sins on earth,'

- he said to the paralytic -

'I say to you: get up, pick up your mat, and go off home.'

And the man got up, and at once picked up his mat and walked out in front of everyone, so that they were all astonished and praised God saying,

'We have never seen anything like this.'
