A reading from the letter of St James

My brothers and sisters, do not let partiality enter into your faith in Jesus Christ, our glorified Lord.

For suppose someone comes into your synagogue, well-dressed and wearing gold rings, and at the same time someone poor, wearing shabby clothes, and you take notice of the well-dressed person, and say, 'Come this way to the best seats'; then you say to the poor person, 'You can stand there' or 'You can sit on the floor by my foot-rest.'

Are you not making distinctions among yourselves and judging on shameful grounds? Listen, my dear brothers and sisters: did not God choose the poor in the world to be rich in faith and to be the heirs to the kingdom which he promised to those who love him?

Returning from the territory of Tyre, Jesus went by way of Sidon towards the Lake of Galilee, right through the Decapolis territory. And they brought him a deaf man who had difficulty speaking; and they asked him to lay his hand on him. He took him away from the crowd on his own, put his fingers into the man's ears and spat and touched his tongue. Then looking up to heaven he sighed; and he said to him,

'Ephphatha,' that is, 'Be opened.'

And his ears were opened, and at once the impediment of his tongue was loosened and he spoke correctly. And Jesus ordered them to tell no one about it, but the more he ordered them, the more widely they proclaimed it. Their admiration was unbounded, and they said,

'Everything he does is good, he makes the deaf hear and the dumb speak.'
