First Reading ‡ Acts 9:26-31

He explained how the Lord appeared to Saul and spoke to him on his journey.

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

When Saul got to Jerusalem he tried to join the disciples, but they were all afraid of him: they did not believe that he was a disciple. Barnabas, however, took charge of him, brought him to the apostles, and explained how on the road he had seen the Lord and spoken to him, and how in Damascus he had spoken fearlessly in the name of Jesus. Saul now started to go in and out with them in Jerusalem, speaking fearlessly in the name of the Lord. He spoke and argued with the Hellenists, and they determined to kill him. When the brothers got to know of this, they took him down to Caesarea and sent him off to Tarsus. The church throughout Judaea, Galilee and Samaria had peace; being built up and progressing in the fear of the Lord; encouraged by the Holy Spirit, it continued to increase in numbers.

By this we shall know that we belong to the truth and it will reassure us in his presence, even if our own hearts condemn us, that God is greater than our hearts and knows all things.

My dear friends, if our own hearts do not condemn us, we can be fearless before God, and whatever we ask we shall receive from him, because we keep his commandments and do what is pleasing to him.

His commandment is this, that we should believe in the name of his Son Jesus Christ and that we should love one another as he commanded us.

Whoever keeps his commandments abides in God, and God in that person. And by this we know that he abides in us, by the Spirit that he has given us.

Gospel # John 15:1-8

All who live in me, and I in them, bear much fruit.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

Jesus said to his disciples:

'I am the true vine, and my Father is the vine-grower. Every branch in me that bears no fruit he cuts away, and every branch that does bear fruit he prunes to make it bear more fruit.

You are clean already, through the word that I have spoken to you. Remain in me, and I in you. As a branch cannot bear fruit by itself, unless it remains part of the vine, neither can you unless you remain in me.

I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me, and I in that person, bears fruit in plenty; for apart from me you can do nothing.

Anyone who does not remain in me is thrown away like a branch and withers.

These branches are collected, thrown on the fire and burnt. If you remain in me and my words remain in you, you may ask for whatever you please and it will be done for you.

In this my Father is glorified, that you should bear much fruit and be my disciples.
