First Reading # Isaiah 40:1-5,9-11

The glory of the Lord shall be revealed, and all people shall see it.

A reading from the prophet Isaiah

'Comfort, O comfort my people,' says your God. Speak to the heart of Jerusalem and cry out to her that her period of service is ended, her penalty has been paid; from the hand of the Lord she has received double for all her sins.'
