You have not come to something accessible to the senses, a *blazing fire*, or *gloom* or *total darkness*, or a *storm*; or *trumpet-blast* or *a voice speaking* which made the hearers beg that no more should be said to them.

But you have come to Mount Zion and the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem where the millions of angels have gathered for the festival, with the whole assembly of the first-born, enrolled in heaven. You have come to God himself, the Judge of all, and to the spirits of the righteous made perfect; and to Jesus, the mediator of a new covenant, and to sprinkled blood which pleads more insistently than Abel's.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

Now it happened that on a Sabbath Jesus had gone to share a meal in the house of one of the leading Pharisees; and they watched him closely.

He then told the guests a parable, because he had noticed how they picked the places of honour. He said this,

'When someone invites you to a wedding feast, do not take your seat in the place of honour, in case a more distinguished person than you has been invited, and the person who invited you both may come and say, "Give up your place to this person."

And then, to your embarrassment, you will have to go and take the lowest place.

No; when you are invited, make your way to the lowest place and sit there, so that, when your host comes, he may say, "My friend, move up higher."

Then, everyone with you at the table will see you honoured. For everyone who raises himself up will be humbled, and the one who humbles himself will be raised up.'

Then he said to his host,

'When you give a lunch or a dinner, do not invite your friends or your brothers or sisters or your relations or rich neighbours, in case they invite you back and so repay you.

No; when you have a party, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind; then you will be blessed, for they have no means to repay you, and so you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous.'
