TWENTY-NINTH SUNDAY



First Reading ‡ Exodus 17:8-13

As long as Moses kept his arms raised, Israel had the advantage.

A reading from the book of Exodus

Then the Amalekites came and attacked Israel at Rephidim. Moses said to Joshua,

'Pick some men for us and tomorrow go out and fight against Amalek. I, for my part, shall take my stand on the top of the hill with the staff of God in my hand.'

Joshua did as Moses had told him and went out to engage Amalek, while Moses, Aaron and Hur went up to the top of the hill. As long as Moses kept his arms raised, Israel had the advantage; when he lowered his arms, the advantage went to Amalek. But Moses' arms grew heavy, so they took a stone and put it under him and he sat on it, with Aaron and Hur supporting his arms on each side. Thus his arms remained steady till sunset, and Joshua defeated Amalek and his people with the sword.

All scripture is inspired by God and useful for teaching, for reproof, for correction and for training in righteousness. This is how someone dedicated to God becomes fully equipped and ready for any good work.

Before God and before Christ Jesus who is to be judge of the living and the dead, I charge you, in the name of his appearing and of his kingdom: proclaim the message and, welcome or unwelcome, insist on it. Refute falsehood, correct error, encourage – with the utmost patience in teaching.
