A reading from the book of Ecclesiasticus

He does not ignore the orphan's supplication nor the widow's as she pours out her complaint. Whoever wholeheartedly serves God will be accepted; such a person's petitions will carry to the clouds.

I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith; all there is to come for me now is the crown of righteousness which the Lord, the righteous judge, will give to me on that Day; and not only to me but also to all those who have longed for his appearing.

But the Lord stood by me and gave me power, so that through me the message might be fully proclaimed and all the gentiles might hear it; and so I was *saved from the lion's mouth*.
