#### First Reading # Acts 15:1-2.22-29

It has been decided by the Holy Spirit and ourselves not to burden you beyond what is essential.

# A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

Then some men came down from Judaea and began to teach the brothers,

'Unless you have yourselves circumcised according to the custom of Moses you cannot be saved.'

As this occasioned disagreement, and no little discussion for Paul and Barnabas with these men, they appointed Paul and Barnabas and some others of the church to go up to Jerusalem and discuss the question with the apostles and elders.

Then the apostles and elders, with the whole church, decided to choose delegates from among themselves to send to Antioch with Paul and Barnabas. They chose Judas, known as Barsabbas, and Silas, both leading men in the brotherhood, and gave them this letter to take with them:

'The apostles and elders, your brothers and sisters, greet the brothers of gentile birth in Antioch, Syria and Cilicia. We hear that some people coming from here, but acting without any authority from ourselves, have disturbed you by their words and have unsettled your minds; and so we have decided unanimously to elect delegates and to send them to you with our beloved Barnabas and Paul, who have committed their lives to the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. Accordingly we are sending you Judas and Silas, who will confirm the same things by word of mouth.

It has been decided by the Holy Spirit and by ourselves not to impose on you any burden beyond these essentials: you are to abstain from food sacrificed to idols, from blood, from the meat of strangled animals and from illicit marriages. Keep yourselves from these, and you will do well. Farewell.'

## A reading from the book of the Apocalypse

In spirit, he carried me to the top of a very high mountain, and showed me the holy city of Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God. It had the glory of God and glittered like a very precious jewel of crystal-clear diamond.

Its wall was of a great height and had twelve gates; at the gates there were twelve angels, and over the gates were written twelve names, which are the names of the twelve tribes of the Israelites; on the east there were three gates, on the north three gates, on the south three gates, and on the west three gates. The city walls stood on twelve foundation stones, and on them the twelve names of the twelve apostles of the Lamb.

I have said these things to you while I am still with you; but the Paraclete, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything and remind you of all I have said to you.

Peace I leave to you, my own peace I give you, not as the world gives do I give to you. Do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid. You heard me say: I am going away and I am coming to you. If you loved me you would be glad that I am going to the Father, for the Father is greater than I.

I have told you this now, before it happens, so that when it does happen you may believe.'
