First Reading # Genesis 15:5-12.17-18

A reading from the book of Genesis

God made a covenant with Abraham, his faithful servant.

Then taking Abram outside, the Lord said,

'Look up at the sky and count the stars if you can. Just so will your descendants be,' he told him.

Abram put his faith in the Lord and this was reckoned to him as righteousness. He then said to him,
